Volunteer Spotlight:

They also started volunteering at mobile adoptions that are held at the Memorial Mall a little more than a year ago.

Cats can only stay at Petsmart for a month, and they failed to find her a home at Grafton during that time so they sent her to the Sheboygan PetSmart where at the time she could be kept longer. She was at the Sheboygan Petsmart for 6 months before FINALLY being adopted by a church of all things. She is now a very proud and happy cat that runs an entire church!! She has an entire staff and congregation that just loves her. Now if that's not success I don't know what is.

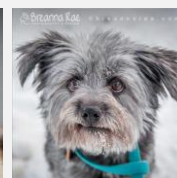

Fun Animal Facts:

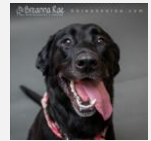
- Dogs' eyes contain a special membrane, called the tapetum lucidum, which allows them to see in the dark.
- 62% of U.S. households own a pet, which equates to 72.9 million homes.
- 45% of dogs sleep in their owner's bed.
- In addition to sweating through their paw pads, dogs pant to cool themselves off. A panting dog can take 300-400 breaths (compared to his regular 30-40) with very little effort.
- Dogs have about 1,700 taste buds. Humans have approximately 9,000 and cats have around 473.
- Cats sleep 70% of their lives, about 16 hours a day.
